SPORTS ARCHIVES AND HERITAGE PRESERVED BY COMPANIES OF MEMORIST SINCE 2008

2008, French Tennis Federation - Vectracom

The French Tennis Federation has called on Vectracom to digitise its film holdings, which include Yannick Noah's training sessions and rare footage of Boris Becker, a leading player at Roland Garros in the late 1980s.

2008-2015, National Rugby League - Vectracom Vectracom carried out a twofold project for the National Rugby League: digitising its video archives and delivering them to their dedicated platform. Among the many films saved are Top14 and Pro D2 matches, broadcast at the time on Canal +.

2009-2023, French Rugby Federation - Arkhênum

The French Rugby Federation has asked Arkhênum to audit, recondition and digitise its collections, all of which trace the history of French rugby since the beginning of the last century.

2011-2023, Musée National du Sport de Nice - Arkhênum

Arkhênum is collaborating with the Musée National du Sport de Nice, which houses one of the largest sports collections in the world, to digitise glass plates and photographs, posters, prints, drawings, and 360° objects including balls, trophies, sculptures and Olympic torches. The digital images will be integrated into Gallica.

2013, National Sports Museum - Vectracom

Since 2013, Vectracom has been digitising the film archives of the National Sports Museum, immortalising the resounding sporting feats and events of the last century.

2016, City of Nîmes - AGP

The city of Nîmes has commissioned AGP to digitise its arenas, with a view to producing a web documentary and a historical reconstruction for the Musée de la Romanité. The 3D reconstruction of the Roman amphitheatre in Nîmes has been incorporated into the educational webdocumentary dedicated to the monument by the City of Nîmes, illustrating the layout and history of this ancient Roman site, which saw centuries of gladiatorial combat, the emblematic sport of ancient Rome, take place within its walls.

2017, Musée du Football Club de Nantes - Arkhênum

Arkhênum has digitised the FC Nantes archives to enrich the collections of the Musée du Club Canaris. Its operators have preserved all the evidence of the life of the club and its supporters: handwritten documents, press articles, photographs, posters and even match tickets.

2020, Mediterranean Football League - Arkhênum

To mark its centenary, the Mediterranean Football League wanted to share its history, and asked Arkhênum to produce a historical book. Professional and amateur football, men's and women's, are represented in the book thanks to an unprecedented selection of official archives, photographs and objects that bear witness to a shared history. Arkhênum supported the League throughout its publishing project.

2020-2021, various French heritage institutions Arkhênum

As part of a call for joint digitisation and enhancement projects in the field of sport, Arkhênum has provided a number of services for sport-related collections.

2022, Kuwait - Vectracom

If sport is always a vector for international encounters, the preservation of its archives is just as important: In 2022, Vectracom will be setting up its workshops in Kuwait to carry out the largest audiovisual digitisation project to date, initiated by the Kuwaiti government. The historical archives include the sporting events that have brought the country together over the last 70 years. The project isscheduled for completion in 2028 and will involve the preservation of around 200,000 hours of video and 19,000 hours of film.

2023, India TV - Vectracom

IndiaTV, one of India's leading news channels, has announced the launch of an unprecedented process to modernise access to its content. Vectracom has been commissioned to digitise the Indian channel's 31,000 hours of content, a large proportion of which relates to sport, thereby helping to preserve a unique audiovisual memory. Supporting this new project in India enables Vectracom to participate in the global effort to modernise the audiovisual landscape in India, the world's leading film industry. Vectracom is the first European company to deploy this type of expertise in a key area of the global audiovisual landscape.

2023, INSEP - Arkhênum With the world going digital, the Institut national du sport, de l'expertise et de la performance has commissioned Arkhênum to digitise a number of sports newspapers, including L'Equipe, in order to offer archive photos in digital format, making them more accessible to both employees and consumers. This strategic decision will enable the newspaper not only to create new editorial content, but also to establish an unprecedented link between the history of sport and current events.

MEMORIST'S EXPERT COMPANIES

Arkhênum: a leader in digitisation and heritage enhancement, Arkhênum helps to shed light on the past and preserve what exists so that history can be passed on to future generations. From archive audits to collection development consultancy, Arkhênum supports its customers at every stage in the development and deployment of their heritage strategies. With the largest technology park in Europe, Arkhênum digitises all types of media, from the simplest to the most complex, whatever their format, material or state of preservation.

Art Graphique & Patrimoine: from laser scanning to 3D digitisation, from 3D modelling to augmented and virtual reality, AGP offers its innovative approach to art and historic monuments, for museums, institutions and businesses. Thanks to its R&D department, which specialises in architectural and archaeological surveys, in 2009 it developed the first mobile augmented reality prototype for reconstructing decors.

La Reliure du Limousin: since it was founded in 1950, the company has been restoring precious works from the libraries of the Senate and the National Assembly, and later from the departmental and municipal archives. TRIBVN Imaging digitises all types of photographic documents (glass plates, cellulose nitrates, cellulose acetates, polyester, etc.), images graphic documents (drawings, tracings), images of textiles and accessories, creates "high-performance" digitisation lines for projects requiring them, takes photogrammetric images and carries out preventive conservation work (repackaging in permanent paper, polyester sleeves, cleaning).

Vectracom: founded in France by Gérard Letienne, Vectracom is now run by Célia Letienne and François Tranchand, representing the second generation. This family management of the company echoes that of the Mobilitas group. Vectracom offers content digitisation, digital preservation, metadata creation and film remastering services, as well as a multimedia laboratory (digitisation from all types of media, colour grading, image and audio restoration, etc.).
